Original IXP Model in Europe

- Early mid 1990ies:
 - Community-driven IXPs with regional/national focus
 - typically (max) one IXP per country
 - interconnecting mainly ISPs on national level to help:
 - avoiding high transit costs
 - keeping traffic local / optimising RTDs

End 1990ies:

- Some IXPs developed significantly more gravity and international profile:
 - AMS-IX and LINX
 - DE-CIX catching up later
- Still neutral / non-profit / community-driven / noncompeting





Friendly Competition

- Early 2000s ~ 2005:
 - Commercial "experiment": XchangePoint Europe
 - Alternative IXP models arising (e.g. TOP-IX, NL-IX)
 - Euro-IX Association founded
 - Some IXP harmonization and benchmarking for the benefit of the peering community in Europe
 - large content providers and CDN's entering peering market

2005 - 2010:

- The few "XXL"-IXPs still growing much faster than the "regionals" through further internationalisation
- First IXP Partner/Reseller Programmes established





Current challenges / Discussion

- "Recently":
- IXP-Ops opening IXPs outside their residence countries
- **IXP-like services "competing" (?)** with traditional IXP model
 - Datacenter operated interconnect services
 - "Cloud Connect" services
 - "International Peering services" (IXP or Carrier service?)
 - Content providers offering IXP services as a by-product

Is there still a reason for the traditional IXP Model?

- "just peering" keeping traffic local / optimising RTDs
- Carrier- & Datacenter-neutral
- non-profit / community-driven / non-competing
